Year 10 and Year 11 Geography Trip

The year 10s and 11s went into central Barcelona for their urban geography field-work. They were investigating regeneration of urban areas as well as looking at how large events such as the 1992 Olympics can regenerate and rebrand desolate areas. They conducted environmental quality surveys, traffic and public counts as well as soundscapes in five different areas. They also got to look at how an old waterworks has been changed into a library.

They were fantastic Geographers who showed interest and initiative in their research. Well done to year 10 and 11. Next they will use their data they collected to complete analysis work and finalise their conclusions on the regeneration of the areas they visited. I am excited to see their results and ideas. IB Theatre - Visit to the Institute of the Arts Barcelona

Our Y13 DP Theatre and Y11 GCSE Drama students visited the Institute of the Arts Barcelona for a Master Class in lighting given by their lighting director. This was organised to support the students as they complete the Director's Notebook component of the DP Theatre course and work towards their GCSE written examination. They participated in the class along with Year 1 Musical Theatre Bachelors students and some of our Y13 students even volunteered to improvise a short performance to demonstrate the use of lighting to create different times, locations and moods. After the class they were given a tour of the theatre by Nick Hollamby, the IAB Principal. We would like to thank the IAB for helping us to arrange this visit and hope to continue to develop our connection with this wonderful performing arts school in the future.

Y12 and Y13 Parent-student-teacher meetings

On Wednesday 2nd November, Y12 and Y13 parents were invited into school to talk with Diploma Programme subject teachers. For Y12 these are informal meetings to check in on how your son/daughter has started their IB journey. For Y13 parents, the purpose of the meeting is to discuss the latest assessment results and targets for students as they continue with their official Internal Assessments (IAs) and work towards the DP Mock Examinations in January. Students must attend the meetings with their parents.

Y11 IB Orientation

Next half term we will run an IB Diploma Programme orientation for all Year 11 students. The sessions will run weekly from October until December and aim to provide students with an overview of the Programme in regards to structure, requirements, expectations and philosophy as well as giving them the chance to listen and talk to IBDP subject teachers.

The schedule is as follows:

Date	Content
8th November	IBDP Overview & Core This session will be run by Ms Fenton and the IBDP Core Team. It will give students an overview of how the IBDP is structured and awarded and explain the requirements of the Core subjects - TOK, EE & CAS.
15th November	Groups 1 & 2 This session will be run by Mr Prosser and Ms Pou, Heads of English and Languages respectively. They will explain the differences between Group 1 and Group 2 language courses and the criteria used in order to ensure that each student chooses the best combination for them.

22nd November	Group 3 Subject teachers and Y12 & Y13 students will give a brief overview of the following subjects: Global Politics, History, Geography, Business Management, Economics & Psychology.
29th November	Groups 4 & 5 This session will be run by Ms Lane and Mr Lester, Heads of Science and Maths respectively. They will explain the differences between the IBDP Maths courses, the Maths and Science subjects that students should study in order to access certain careers and the school's criteria for being able to study Maths or Science courses at HL.
13th December	Group 6 This session will be run by BCG Arts Department. Subject teachers and Y12 & Y13 students will give a brief overview of the following subjects: Theatre, Visual Arts and Music.
20th December	How to choose This session will be run by Mr Mower, Ms Fenton and Ms Pou. Students will be guided through the process of choosing their options including how to use Unifrog effectively.

We hope that these sessions will equip our students with the knowledge and guidance they need to make informed option choices.

Playing in such matches encourages and motivates children, and these friendly competitions aim to help them enjoy participation in football in a respectful environment. This league is not as competitive as when they play at Club Level and is therefore open to beginners as well as experienced players.

Matches will be played on the Marcel·lí Moragas courts on Friday afternoons, every fortnight. They start on the 11th November and finish in May 2023. We will send parents a calendar and updated information as soon as everything is finalised.

The cost is 150€ for the whole season, and you would be charged mid-november. This includes enrollment, pitch fees, the compulsory insurance, the player's card (ficha) and covers all staff / referee and administration costs.

4. Year 11 Ski Trip Proposal

Our sister school, the British College of Andorra, have offered our year 11 students the opportunity to join their BCA students for some ski fun from Wednesday 15th February to Sunday 19th February 2023.

The purpose of the trip is to help balance the year and allow a final chance for our year 11 students to rest and relax before committing to an intense study programme for their impending end of year exams. The bonus of the year 11 students from both school's mixing is that they can share approaches to learning, ideas and perspectives and develop knowledge and understanding **with** each other. During evening activities there will be 'us versus them' academic quizzes, and such like, in between socialising to keep student minds active!

At present, this trip is **estimated to cost 745 euros**. The final cost depends on numbers signing up. Last year, families paid 630 euro per student to ski at La Molina (670 for snowboarders). Using this as a guide, BCA are offering us an amazing deal to travel to their magnificent resorts in Andorra with ski pass access to ALL slopes, full board hotel accommodation and an evening programme with academic and social activities built-in (bowling, snow shoeing, night walks etc.).

GAVÀ, MUNICIPAL COUNCIL FOR CHILDREN

Y6 and Y7 have been participating, since last October, in an interesting initiative promoted by the Gavà City Council, the Consell Municipal d'Infants, a project about learning and citizenship.

The main objective is the incorporation of the children's perspective in local policies, creating spaces for listening and participation.

What is the Municipal Council for Children?

- It is a child participation body of the Gavà City Council
- It is made up of counselors who are the spokespersons for each classroom of Y6 (5th grade) and Y7 (6th grade) of all the schools in the municipality
- The objective of the council is to be able to give an opinion, investigate, propose and make improvements for the municipality and for its citizens
- It is based on an annual assignment and through the participation of the directors, the improvement action is specified. At all times, the counselor keeps the rest of the classmates informed and in many cases, they also participate

How is the Municipal Council for Children developed?

- 1 working session with representatives of the Council per month (Monday from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.) at Minas de Gavà Archaeological Park
- Plenary sessions at the Gavà Town Hall
- Work sessions with school students
- Active collaboration with all entities that work with and for children
- Participation in city activities aimed at children

Who are the BCG Y6 and Y7 counselors?

- Year 6: Lola and Jorge
- Year 7: Manel and Noa

Tasks and responsibilities of our representative counselors:

- Commitment to actively participate in the Consell, attending all sessions
- Represent your class, the school and all the children of Gavà



- Collect the opinions of their peers and take them to the Consell
- Inform of the agreements of the Consell
- Participate in institutional events on behalf of the Consell

Summary of what happened in the Consell d'Infants to date:

- Monday, October 10th:

Meeting with all the families of the representatives of all the schools of Gavà.

- Monday October 17th:

Opening of the Consell d'Infants de Gavà with the participation and assistance of 42 councilors.. Welcome by the Mayor, Gemma Badia and the fourth deputy mayor, Ester Zamorano, in charge of the field of welfare, education and culture. They encouraged the boys and girls to help the City Council in the improvement of Gavà for all the children of the municipality and they summoned them in the Plenary on November 21. The first task entrusted to them was the creation of a logo for the Consell d'Infants in which all Y6 and Y7 classmates could participate. All the councilors agreed on the general characteristics to be able to participate

- Humanities Y6 and Y7:

Ms Sadurní and Mr Sales have let the representatives explain to the rest of their classmates what are the characteristics of participation in the logo contest, and those students wanted to are now working on the creation of the logo.

In the next Newsletter, we will inform you about the progress, agreements and tasks that our representatives of the Consell d'Infants de Gavà are working on.
