Primary Summer Concerts

What a week this has been for music in BCG! We began with the Primary Summer Concert on Tuesday which featured 130 children in our primary choir and more than 20 children in our primary orchestra. I cannot commend the children enough for the hardwork and dedication they showed over the year and indeed on the runup to the concert. From following a conductor and understanding their musical cues, to singing in harmony and dancing in unison, the children displayed excellent performance skills while showcasing their learning this week. Each week the children attend a choir lesson (as well as their weekly music lesson) and it has been amazing to watch the choir grow in confidence and capability over the year. I could not be prouder of the children in Year 3, 4, 5 and 6!

Our second concert of the week was opened by our Year 2 children playing the violins, claves and eggs. This was followed by the Year 3 students playing the violins and cellos. Both year groups have spent months rehearsing for this concert! Learning to play the violin or cello is about so much more than just playing the instrument. Children need to learn how to hold the instrument, what posture to maintain when playing the instrument, how to read sheet music, how to follow a conductor, how to count the beat to know when to play, how to care for an instrument, how to play as part of an ensemble...and so much more! While playing the instrument is obviously a very important part of our lessons, teaching children how to use an instrument and how to set themselves up for success is at the centre of our approach to musical development and creating lifelong musicians. I was so proud seeing 60 of our youngest school children performing this week in what was the biggest orchestral performance BCG has ever had!

As always, our concerts could not happen without the support of many BCG staff. I would like to thank Cesar and Vicu for setting up the venue for both concerts this week. Both men spent hours moving furniture and supporting us with the setup. Ruben controlled our IT and we would have been lost without his excellent understanding of the sound system! Thank you Cesar, Vicu and Ruben!

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents that ALL children from Year 3, 4, 5 & 6 can join our orchestra (for free!) next year. Even if your child is not learning an instrument, he/she can still join the orchestra to learn the basics of playing his/her chosen instrument. If he/she really likes the instrument then we can discuss instrumental lessons. Your child can borrow an instrument from the school until you are confident that your child is going to continue with lessons at which point you can consider buying an instrument.

Sign up for instrumental lessons will also be open soon. Please feel free to contact me with any questions you may have.

I would like to thank those of you who attended our concerts this week. After more than two years without a live audience it really added so much excitement and

Year 5 & 6 visits Barcelona: Gaudí Tour + Roman Barcelona: Barcino

As part of the curricular activities for the Social Studies subject, Year 5 and Year 6 students took a tour of Paseo de Gracia to see and appreciate first-hand some of the modernist buildings of this great artist. Afterwards, they made a guided visit to the MUHBA museum where they were able to delve into the Roman culture that created the city of Barcino.

This modernist tour allowed the students to get to know and walk through one of the main streets of Barcelona, observing the studied characteristics of Gaudí in the buildings “La Pedrera” and “La Casa Batlló”.

On the other hand, with the guided tour of the MUHBA museum they were able to see part of the first wall of the city of Barcino, as well as the remains of a house, spa, aqueduct, etc. still preserved inside and outside the museum.

Thanks to both activities, the students were not only able to better understand and approach the Roman era and modernism, but they were also able to appreciate and see first-hand the studied work of Antoni Gaudí.

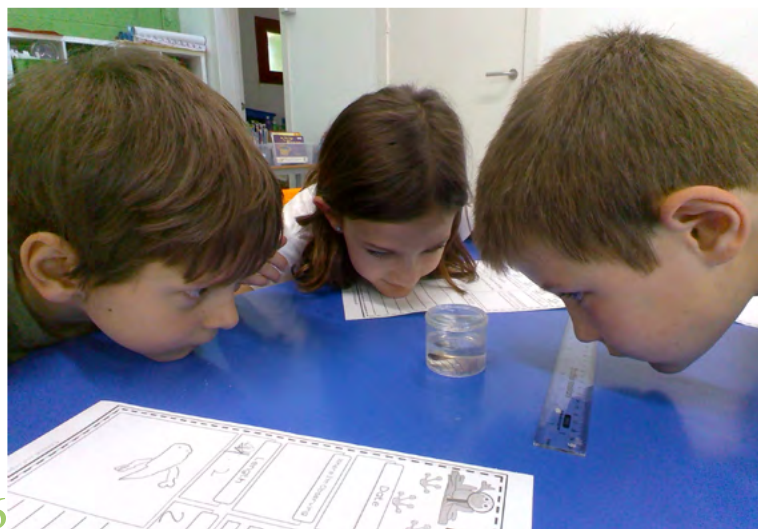


Year 2 Science

This term in Science Year 2 we were studying Life cycles and habitats. As part of this topic we have had some class pets - tadpoles! Over the term we watched them develop through their life cycle into froglets with arms, froglets with arms and legs and finally into little frogs. The children used an observation recording form to monitor the progress of the tadpoles into frogs, measuring them and writing about the changes they could see. They were able to take responsibility for feeding the tadpoles too, did you know they like to eat cucumber?!

Now the end of term is approaching and the tadpoles have become frogs, Miss Baker will be returning them to the pond where she collected them so they can continue their life cycle in the wild.

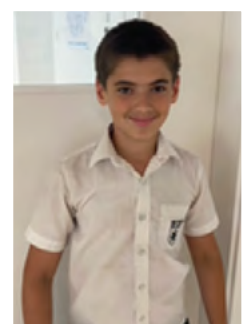
