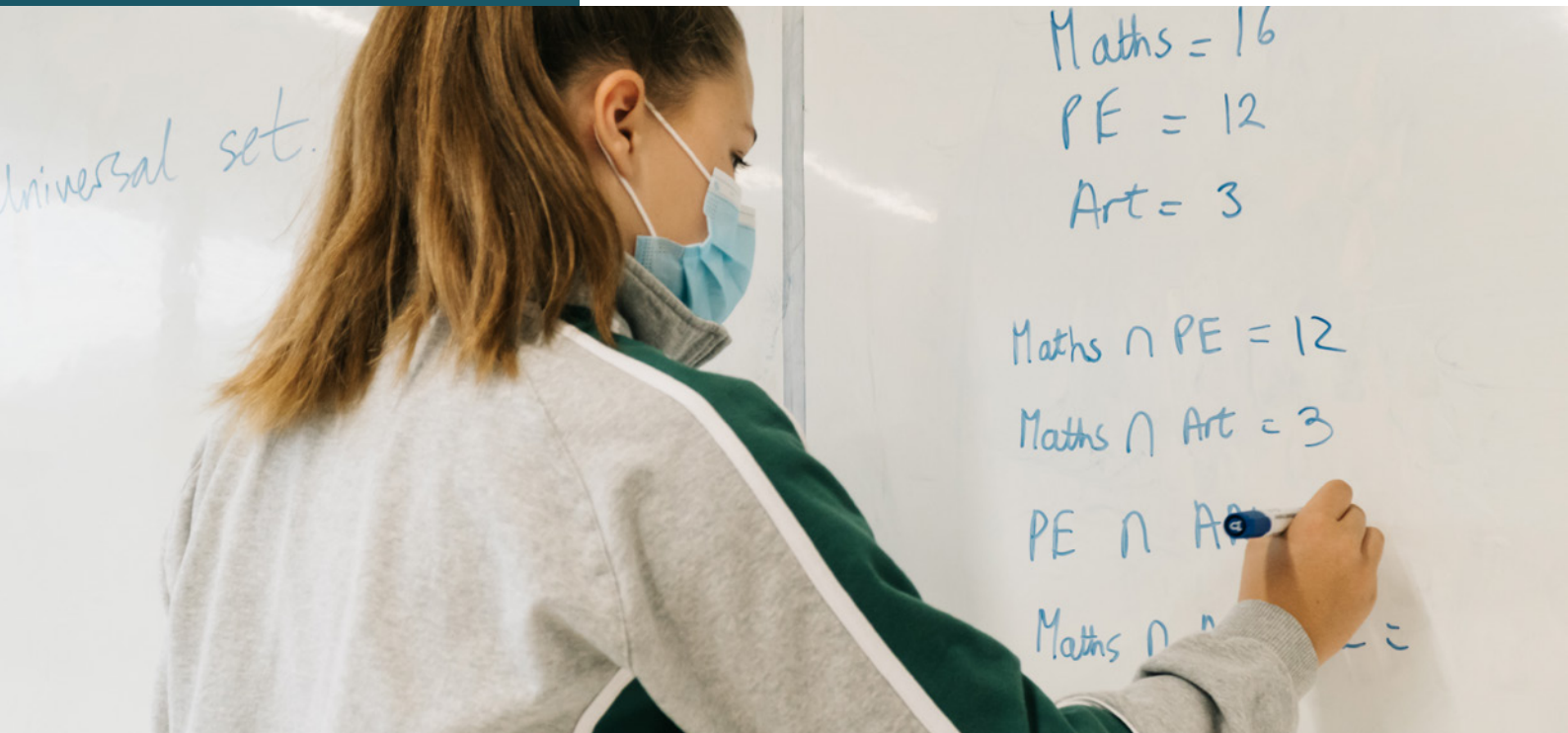

EYFS & Primary

Dear EYFS & Primary Parents and Pupils,

This week's special feature is all about Christmas at BCG. Covid may have cancelled many holidays, family visits and last minute getaways but it has not cancelled Christmas! Here at school, we have been working hard on organising a variety of special Christmas experiences for all of our pupils which we are sure they will thoroughly enjoy.

EYFS & Lower Primary

Every pupil from Nursery to Year 2 will have a very special visitor arriving on Friday 18th December...you guessed it... Father Christmas is coming to BCG. We will be transforming our old dining area into a Winter Wonderland with a Santa's Grotto. Children will visit Santa in their classes and each receive a small wrapped gift. They will also visit the new dining hall for a special festive drink and snack. On this day, pupils will be allowed to wear Christmas clothes. Teachers and children will be designing and making a Christmas themed garden activity to play such as: 'Santas shootout and 'Pin the nose on Rudolph'.

Upper Primary

The Christmas Fair is one of the highlights of the year where we can all get together as a community and share joy and excitement for the festive period ahead. Sadly, due to Covid, we cannot permit parents to participate; however, we have decided to adapt the format of the fair so that each class will run their own mini-Christmas Fair within their classrooms. Pupils will organise and run their own stalls where they can do a game, a mystery challenge or sell something they have made. To ensure we are safe in our 'bubbles', only the members of the class can visit each stall. We will decorate our classrooms and rearrange our desks and chairs to ensure safe space for setting up the stalls.

We will operate a token system, as we have done in previous years. Your child will be able to purchase 10 tokens for 5 euro. These tokens can be used to 'buy' things at the stalls, have a go at a game or fun challenge and to purchase festive snacks and drinks. The snacks and drinks stalls will be set up in our dining hall which will be decorated and full of festive cheer. We are really pleased that we are able to provide our pupils with an alternative Christmas Fair experience. On this day, pupils will be allowed to wear Christmas clothes. This event takes place on Friday 18th December during the school day. Please collect your child at the normal pick up time.

Traditional Christmas Dinner

On the final day of school, Tuesday 22nd December, all pupils across the school will be served a traditional English Christmas dinner with all the trimmings, including roast potatoes, delicious meats and a selection of tasty vegetables. As well as the pupils, I know the staff team are VERY much looking forward to this special treat.

Christmas Activities

In the lead up to the final week of Christmas, each class participates in a range of Christmas-themed activities. This year we will be decorating our huge Christmas tree in the reception area of the main building. Each class will be making a set of decorations for the tree and to hang around the school. Any children who enjoy crafts on the weekend are very welcome to make a decoration at home and add it to the tree. The children will also be participating in a 'design a Christmas card' competition. The winning card chosen from each class will win a book! Please encourage your child to enter. Santa's elves will be delivering a box of Christmas craft materials for each class to complete their activities.

Christmas Performances

One of the many highlights of Christmas at BCG is sharing the festive songs children have learned in their Music lessons around our Christmas tree. Traditionally at BCG, we have had all of our EYFS and Primary children sitting around the enormous, beautifully decorated tree ready to sing their hearts out. Our Secondary pupils would fill the stairs, as the 6th form students

would peer over the balcony, dropping snow on the pupils below as they sang. Under normal circumstances, we would be inviting you in to share this joyous occasion. Instead, this year, we will continue with this tradition but with a few adaptations. We will be making a video of each class as they perform their songs around the Christmas tree. Each class will perform separately so as to adhere to Covid protocols but will all enjoy the sprinkled snow which is a highlight for most children. Our special Christmas video will be shared with you so you can view the fantastic performances from each class and feel at least a part of Christmas with us. We will invite siblings to watch the performances of their brothers and sisters.

The holiday season approaches! With it, a great opportunity to rethink some old habits and try something different and more sustainable this year.

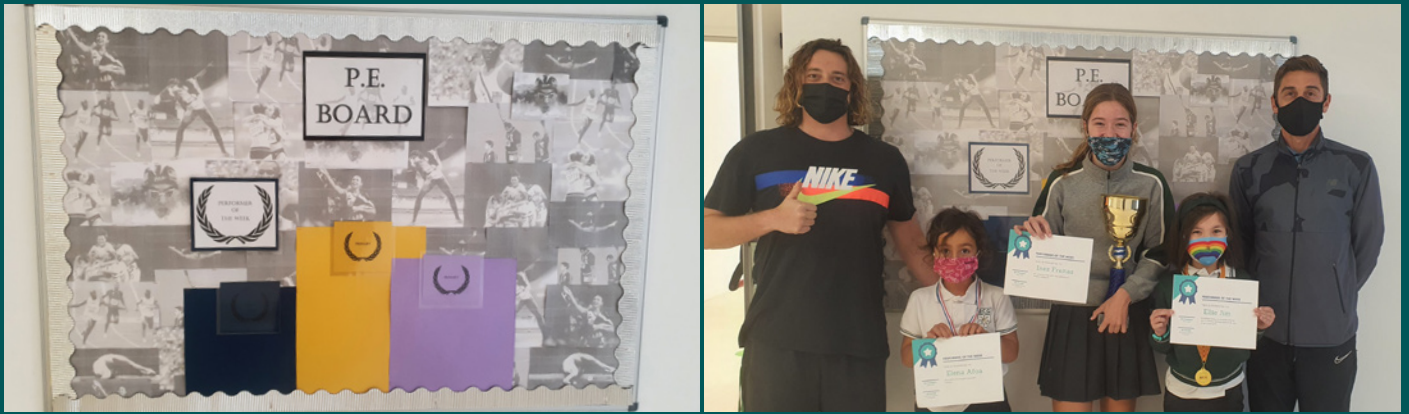
